

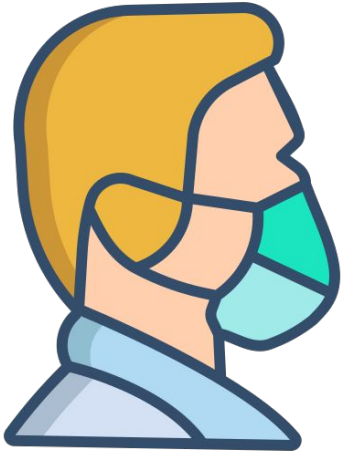

March 1, 2021:

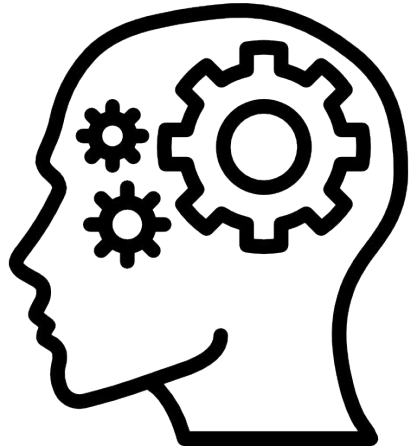
Governor Phil Murphy announced starting March 15th Pre-K to 12 educators and support staff will be eligible for the Covid vaccination.

New Jersey Student Learning Assessments (NJSLA)

- [February 11th](#): NJDOE postpones the planned start date of all assessments and plans to begin statewide assessment administration no earlier than April 5, 2021.
 - [February 19th](#): NJDOE announced it will request the United States Department of Education (USED) to waive the federal Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) requirement to administer the statewide assessment system for the 2020-2021 school year.
 - [February 25th](#): NJDOE requests that local school districts share locally administered assessments to provide a snapshot of student learning during this school year.
